TOP TIPS

- Check the <u>www.smartraveller.gov.au</u> website for regular updates of our Travel Advice for Germany.
- Ensure you have a valid ID with you at all times. Keep a copy of your passport separate from your original passport.
- Keep in touch with family and friends so they are aware of your plans. Save next of kin contact details in your passport.
- Do not carry large amounts of cash with you. Tourists can be targets of petty theft.
- If you do lose your passport or any other items obtain a police report from the local police for insurance purposes.
- Wear solid footwear! A cut to feet from broken glass is one of the most common reasons to seek medical assistance at Oktoberfest.

RESPECT LOCAL LAWS

- We urge all Australians attending Oktoberfest to behave responsibly and to respect local laws and customs.
- Bavarian authorities have a zero tolerance policy on illegal drugs
- Bavarian authorities have imposed harsher penalties (including imprisonment) than would be received in Australia for antisocial behaviour. For example, a charge of assault with a deadly weapon has been levied for fights with beer steins.
- It is a criminal offence to steal beer steins from tents.
- Police video surveillance operates throughout the entire Oktoberfest Grounds.

HOW TO GET CONSULAR ASSISTANCE

Throughout Oktoberfest, Australian consular staff will be available in Munich, Berlin and Frankfurt to provide consular assistance and can be contacted through the numbers above.

After hours emergency assistance can be sourced by ringing the 24 hour Consular Emergency Centre on the above number.

WHAT AUSTRALIAN CONSULAR STAFF CAN DO

- With most problems 'we can help you to help yourself'.
- If you lose your passport we can issue an emergency travel document in Frankfurt or Berlin. This is subject to background checks and confirmation of ID. This document has short term validity. If a document is lost or stolen you will also incur a lost and stolen fee. Please make an appointment with Passport officers in Berlin and Frankfurt for replacement travel documents.
- Offer advice on transferring funds and getting in contact with local authorities.
- In cases of illness, accidents, serious injury or death, arrange for next of kin to be informed and offer advice on procedures.
- Provide list of local lawyers or doctors who speak English.
- If time and circumstances permit, visit Australian citizens if arrested, or in hospital. Arrange for messages to be passed on to next of kin.

WHAT AUSTRALIAN CONSULAR STAFF CANNOT DO

- We do not assist with work normally carried out by travel agents, airlines, banks etc.
- We do not pay hotel, medical, legal or other fees.
- We can not get you out of prison or interfere in the German judicial process and we do not give legal advice or start court proceedings.
- We can not get you preferential treatment in hospitals or prisons.
- We do not get involved in crime investigation.

Transfers can be made online via credit card on the Western Union website; the money can then be collected in Germany at the Reisebank (found in most large train stations and airports) or a post office. You will be required to present your passport. A deposit can also be made in Australia through Travelex or designated Australia Post outlets.
